GENERAL OVERVIEW

Executive Summary

The State of Idaho is still in the process of collecting data on the best uses of the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund in order to adhere to the guidelines established for the use of the funds and to comply with the Idaho Legislative mandate that the one time funds should be used to the extend allowable under law to make long-range investments that will benefit the citizens of Idaho, and that the use of the funds should not impede or inhibit the state's constitutional mandate to provide for a balanced budget for the people of Idaho.

The Idaho Legislature currently has established a legislative working group to evaluate the use of the funds, and in conjunction with the Governor and the executive branch agencies the goal is to make decisions on the use of the funds during the 2022 Legislative Session which begins in January 2022. After the decisions on the use of the funds have been finalized the State will update the recovery plan to include all the necessary elements.

Uses of Funds

The State of Idaho will be making decisions on the use of the funds during the 2022 Legislative Session. The State is still in the data collection and evaluation stage of the decision- making process and is evaluating the best use of the funds within the allowable uses.

In the 2021 Session the Idaho Legislature did provide an initial \$ 50 million appropriation from the funds to be available to the Governor to utilize for needs related to the COVID-19 pandemic to include but not limited to vaccine distribution and management, personal protective equipment, communications, public safety, and related technology needs.
